



XIB FWB LIS'S PRESENTATION AT THE MCTLC CONFERENCE

Recently, Koobmeej Lee, one of our K-5 wonderful Hmong Language educators, presented at the Minnesota Council on the Teaching of Languages and Cultures (MCTLC) Fall Conference: Unity in Diversity. Under the unifying topic of "Perspectives on Hmong Heritage Teaching," Language Koobmeej joined two other local Hmong language professionals in sharing their research and expertise. Specifically, Koobmeej shared his Master's work on gamification as a motivator in Hmong learning with language session attendees, and he also demonstrated and involved attendees in some of the activities he designed to help teach and support his students. The conference also featured presentations from other HCPA educators, Maureen Wu and Changying Lawton.

MINNESOTA GOES TO COLLEGE MONTH

During the month of October our Juniors and Seniors participated in "Minnesota Goes to College", formerly College Knowledge Month, with the goal of developing a plan for life after high school. In the 12th grade, specifically, students were tasked with completing applications to the colleges they had researched as Juniors.

- 68% of Seniors have completed an application as of Thursday, 10/31, and a wave of students ready to submit before the end of the week.
- Over 400 applications were completed
- 40 Applications to out-of-state schools

Two CP Classes hit the target of 100% of students completing an application (as of Thursday)- Ms. Spencer's NYU Violets, and Ms. Bouldan's Stanford Cardinal.

FOOD

The food department is off to a great start. Our Fresh Fruits and Vegetables program (FFVP) is offering many tropical fruits as they are in season. The goal is to offer a greater variety of fruits and vegetables to get students excited about eating healthy and trying new fruits & vegetables. FFVP will be offered Monday - Friday for students in grades K-5 and Tuesday and Thursday for students in grades 6-8.

Community Eligibility Program or our breakfast and lunch program is making great changes. We have added more options items such as shredded cheese, broccoli, and cherry tomato to the salad bar. The food department is also working hard to provide higher quality breaded chicken products. We have conducted a taste test with our students and staff, and they had positive feedback about the new breaded chicken products. In the next few weeks, we will replace our chicken patty, tenders, and nuggets to a higher-grade option.
