ASPIRNAUT SUMMER RESEARCH PROGRAM

Congratulations to Sophomore Ku Moo and Junior Angel Chang for being awarded a spot at Vanderbilt University for their 6-week Aspirnaut Summer Research Program. This Research program is fully funded. Students accepted to this program are embedded in a biomedical research laboratory for six weeks. They work on diabetes, cancer, and regenerative biology projects. Students conduct their own research and gather results that contribute to the data and goals of the larger research team. After the experience, students present their research to peers and mentors.


